## LOCAL SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

### Fu Jun



Fu Jun, Executive Dean of School of Government, is Professor of Political Economy and Public Policy at Peking University. He has been Advisor to Chairman of the Executive Council of UNESCO, and member of the 11-person Visiting Committee for International and Area Studies Programs across Schools at Harvard University. He is the author of *Institutions and Investments* and *The Dao of the Wealth of Nations*, and was a contributing author of World Economic Forum's flagship publication *Global Agenda Outlook*(2013, 2014). With Nobel Laureate Michael Spence, he co-chairs the Global Agenda Council on New Growth Models at Davos, and appears regularly as a commentator on CCTV News. Professor Fu received his BA from Beijing Foreign Studies University, a LLB from the Foreign Affairs College, and PhD in Political Economy from Harvard University. He is President of Harvard Alumni Association in Beijing, and sits on the Advisory Committee of the Beijing International Music Festival.

### Zhang Jian

Dr. Zhang Jian is an Associate Professor at Peking University's School of Government. He joined Peking University's faculty in 2007, returning to the university where he completed his undergraduate studies. Zhang Jian received his PhD in political science from Columbia University in the City of New York. His research interests include ethnic minority issues in China, identity politics, political participation and state/nation building in the developing world. He teaches Chinese politics, American politics and ethnic studies at Peking University. He is also in charge of the international cooperation programs at the School of Government.



### Russell Menyhart



Russell C. Menyhart, a former diplomat with the State Department, recently joined Taft Stettinius & Hollister LLP's Indianapolis office as an of counsel attorney. Russell is working to develop Taft's international practice, with a focus on anti-corruption laws and export controls, including the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act (FCPA), International Trade in Arms Regulations (ITAR), and Export Administration Regulations (EAR). He also is active in promoting the growth of social entrepreneurship in central Indiana, including advising benefit corporations and certified B corporations. Russell worked for the U.S. State Department for nine years, including serving as vice counsel at the U.S. Embassy in Beijing from 2005-07 and political unit chief at the U.S. Consulate in Shanghai from 2011-14. Russell graduated magna cum laude from the IU Maurer School of Law and has B.A. in East Asian Studies from Oberlin College.
